As part of the application, you are required to secure written statements from three references. One must be from a teacher who knows you well.

Recipients will be selected by the Scholarship Committee, and may be persons of any race, color or creed. The scholarship may be granted for undergraduate or graduate study in any accredited college or university.

The completed application, including the references, shall be returned to the appropriate office at the high school.

Applicants may be requested to meet with the Scholarship Committee.

All applicants will be considered and will be notified of the decision of the Scholarship Committee with further instructions regarding the award.

Applications are due by March 15.
